

Wren Ten Appeal Wren Music's Fundraising Challenge 2019/20

Perform

One of the most fun ways for members of Wren Music regular groups to raise money for the Wren Ten Appeal is going to be by performing with other musicians at local events, and donating any fee or contribution that you receive from the event organiser to the appeal.

Here are a few tips to ensure your performance is a success.

1. Check how you are described

Unless your group leader is attending the event, please be clear with the organiser that you are **fundraising for** Wren Music, and that you are not **representing** Wren Music as an organisation. This might sound like a subtle difference, but it is important to Wren Music's professional reputation that it is only when your group leader is with you that you are described as representing the organisation.

2. Get your arrangements confirmed in writing

This doesn't need to be anything as complicated as a contract, but it's a good idea to have it confirmed by email or in a letter. The details covered could include the venue of the performance, how long you will play or sing for, and how much will be donated in return.

3. Work out how much to ask for

The amount you request will depend on lots of different things, including how long you will play for, how much money the organisers have, and how many of you are attending.

We can't give explicit advice on how much you should ask for, the best advice we have is to take the time, as a group, to make sure that everyone involved in the performance is happy that their contribution is being recognised with an appropriate amount of money.

Top tip: you might also be able to find ways at the event to raise even more funds towards the Wren Ten Appeal, with a donation tin or craft stall (see the 'organise' page). Make sure you check with the organisers before doing any additional fundraising at the event.

4. Use it as a recruitment opportunity

You never know, you might be performing to a group of people who really want to have a go at singing or playing an instrument, but don't know how to go about it. So remember to tell the audience about your Wren Music regular group and invite people to join.

5. Enjoy yourself!

Thank you! It is really great that you want to use your time and energy to raise funds for Wren Music in this way. Remember that enjoying yourself is the primary aim, so have fun!

Give

Shop

You can raise valuable funds for the Wren Ten Appeal every time you shop online.

Easy Fundraising is an online platform that generates donations based on your online shopping – at no extra cost to you.

Choose from over 3,600 retailers including M&S, Amazon, eBay, Argos, Travelodge, Tesco, Apple, Waitrose, Aviva and the AA. In your Easy Fundraising account you can see the donations adding up.

Join for free and choose to support Wren Music. Each time you want to buy something online (food shopping, clothes shopping, renewing insurance, changing broadband supplier – anything!) just start out on the Easy Fundraising website. From there you simply click through to the retailer's website and then we receive donations. At no extra cost to you.

Organise

You can turn almost any event into a fundraiser. You can ask for a donation from the people attending or if you're going to do something that's a challenge for you, you can ask people to sponsor you.

If you want to use an online system for gathering donations, we are registered with **www.wonderful.org** who pass on 100% of the donation and the Gift Aid directly to Wren Music.

Here are ten event suggestions for ways to fundraise for the Wren Ten Appeal:

Sponsored Swimming Challenge

A group of you could work together to swim a long distance. Or you could ask people to pledge an amount for every length of the pool you swim in thirty minutes.

Dinner party, barbecue or garden party at your home

You provide the food and entertainment and ask people to make a donation to attend.

Knit-a-thon

Gather together a group of knitters and see how long you can keep going for. You could ask for pledges for every hour you knit, or for every inch of knitting you create.

Group Hike

Pack up your lunch and head for the hills – make sure you get sponsored before you go. You could ask for donations for each mile that you walk.

Sponsored Silence

This seems like the opposite of what people who make music would want to do, but maybe that extra challenge will raise even more sponsorship.

Sponsored Cycle Challenge – on the roads or on static bikes

You could tackle a gruelling course or an extra long distance.

Cake or Craft Sale

Homemade treats could raise donations at work or at school. Please ask our permission if you want to use the Wren logo on anything you make.

Tasting Evening – cheese or wine or chocolate or beer

Invite your friends over for a selection of tastes they might not have tried before.

Dress-Down Day (or non-uniform day) at work or at school

Arrange with your school/employer to allow everyone to wear different clothes for one day, and ask everyone to make a donation. You could even dress up as your favourite musician.
